



The story of Curlew Tagging




We chat with Dr Samantha Franks, a senior research ecologist at the BTO whose unwavering passion for wader birds has enabled her to dive deep into the world of curlew conservation, and Rich Bunce, an award-winning photographer who joined Sam and her team for a day in the Dales to photograph their last day of curlew-tagging fieldwork.



ack in April this year, researchers at the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) embarked on a crucial curlew conservation project in the Yorkshire Dales, fitting a select number of the birds with GPS tags to help build a clearer picture of the potential causes for the species' decline. In 2015, curlews, the largest European wader bird, were added to the 'Red List' of the UK's Conservation Status Report, officially classifying them as an endangered species. With a rapid population decline in the past 20 years that has caused the number of curlew breeding pairs to fall by almost 50%, the BTO's extensive research into and dedication towards conserving wild bird species is more critical now than ever.

"It's an ongoing project," Sam explains, "where the BTO is working with the Yorkshire Dales National Parks Authority to monitor waders in the dales. By GPS tagging curlews breeding in different habitats, we aim to find information that we can feed back into improving wildlife-friendly farming measures to help the species' breeding success.

"We tagged the curlews at the beginning of their breeding season, shortly after they arrived back in Yorkshire from wherever they've spent the winter," Sam continues. "They set up a territory, pair up with mates, defend their territory against other pairs, lay a nest, and then incubate their eggs for 20-30 days. If they get through to raising chicks, that will take them to around the end of June. This whole process coincides with periods of peak farming activity – lambing, grazing cattle, hay cutting – and so by tagging the birds; we can find out if they stay in one field and how big the area they move around in is, allowing farmers to potentially modify their practices so they don't accidentally mow nests



or chicks. We hope that the information gained from the project will feed into new nature-friendly farming policies and decisions, especially as there have been many changes to subsidies given to farmers for nature-friendly farming approaches since the UK has left the EU."

Sam is eager to spotlight the invaluable contribution local Yorkshire landowners made to the project. "Whether it was farmers, gamebird estate managers, or gamekeepers, it was clear to all of us that we were fortunate to have the support of locals with a lot of knowledge and love for curlews," she recalls. "We were very grateful to work with people who cared about breeding waders and wanted to improve their fortunes. It was also lovely to show them curlews in hand – they often only ever saw them from afar, so they marvelled at seeing the birds up close and in person! We told Rich this when he joined us – we warned him that we couldn't

promise to catch anything on the day he was with us, but we, quite unusually, managed to catch two that day!"

Wildlife has been a lifelong interest for Sam, who grew up in Canada and is currently based in the BTO's main offices in Norfolk. University allowed her to focus more generally on birds, and since coming to the UK and working with the BTO, she has been able to pursue her love for waders like curlews. "Curlews are almost like the pandas of the bird world," she laughs, "because they're just so charismatic! They're quite big; they have a distinct bill and an undeniable call, so people love them. They're a very iconic species of the British countryside, and they're certainly the species I have the most affinity with."

Photographer Rich Bunce joined the project through his involvement with Curlew Action, a charity set up by author Mary Colwell which aims

to give curlews a secure future through supporting conservation efforts, highlighting curlews' cultural importance, and engaging with science and government policy. A Curlew Action event in December 2022 enabled Rich to contact Sam and the team at the BTO, who informed him of the upcoming Curlew tagging project in the Dales.

Originally from Kingston upon Thames, Rich moved north in 2010, eventually settling in the small West Yorkshire village of Burley in Wharfedale. In 2013, he founded 'Walking Photography', a passion project that offers practical photography lessons for people of all abilities and experience levels. "The identity of a walking photographer really appealed to me," he explains, "as it leaves me the freedom to do what I want. Even though I tend to lean towards nature and wildlife, I don't feel confined to that photography category. It's freeing."

Much like Sam's interest in wildlife, Rich's passion for photography came at an early age, ever since receiving his first camera bought by his mum from the Avon catalogue. After earning his BA (Hons) in Photography & Digital Imaging, Rich enjoyed much success as a freelance photographer, working with a variety of clients, from small businesses all the way up to slightly more famous clients like M&S and Coca-Cola.

Yet despite this immense success (not to mention his numerous awards and international exhibitions), Rich is keen to emphasise that the quaint world of

nature is his primary source of inspiration. "I love being outdoors and, from a young age, have been lucky enough to be absorbed in nature. I think that inspired me to do the workshops I offer," he says, "as I combine my passion for photography with my love of nature whilst simultaneously sharing it with others. The workshops have significantly grown in the past ten years; it's been lovely.

"I think we're fortunate in the UK to be surrounded by such gorgeous scenery," Rich continues, "we can immerse ourselves in nature, and it's just wonderful." Sam builds on this further, explaining how spreading this love of wildlife and birds to urban areas is a key focus of the BTO. "We are so lucky in the UK to have so many nature reserves where we can access nature on both a big and small scale - it gives people a really wonderful interest in nature. I'm very fortunate to live in rural Norfolk," she explains, "where there are so many birds and so much wildlife on my doorstep, but that's not always the case for people who live in bigger cities. I know the BTO is working hard to bring this interest in nature to more urban areas, particularly to young people who do not have easy access to these vast wildlife areas."

Having recently celebrated its 90th birthday in July 2023, the BTO is showing no signs of ending its unwavering dedication to researching and implementing conservation methods for some of the UK's most endangered bird species. And it is clear that the tireless work of the organisation's passionate researchers like Sam will lead to many positive developments in the world of bird conservation, with the project back in April in particular hopefully looking to make many invaluable contributions to both improving wildlife-friendly farming measures and to helping to slow the decline of curlews in and around the Dales.

IT'S WORTH TALKING ABOUT

James Crickmore talks to founder **Ryan Anderton** about the charity helping Keighley locals open up. >>

n an overcast day at the beginning of August, 17,000 music lovers descended on the Bingley Weekender. The atmosphere was ecstatic, with the crowd enthusiastically singing along to Noel Gallagher's High Flying Birds, Travis and the legendary The Lancashire Hotpots. Photos show fans in traditional festival revelry, and many of them are holding up a frame with the words #ItsWorthTalkingAbout.

The Keighley mental health charity had headed down to the festival to capture the atmosphere within their charity's colourful picture frames, chat, and spread the word that mental health matters.

Formed in March 2020, it was initially set up as a single men's mental health peer support group in Keighley but has now developed into a multi-group, multi-sex organisation covering the Worth & Aire Valley.

The aim of #ItsWorthTalkingAbout is to provide safe, confidential spaces for men & women to come and talk about anything affecting their well-being, mental health or quality of life.

"I suffered with my mental health in the past to the point where I was a resident at Airedale Hospital for ten weeks in 2010. That started my own mental health journey," Ryan Anderton, the founder of the Keighley charity, explains. After several suicide attempts, Ryan stumbled across Andy's Man's Club in Hebden Bridge, a male peer-to-peer support group. Being able to talk about his struggles openly worked for him in a way that medication hadn't. He also discovered a hobby through others in the group – cycling.

Amazingly, in 2018, despite only taking up cycling two years previously, Ryan decided to cycle 4,800 miles around the entire coastline of Britain to raise money for mental health charity Mind. He managed to raise nearly £7,000 and completed the epic journey after six weeks in the saddle, despite being hit by a car on the third day of the trip.

The following year, he set himself another challenge – to ride through 12 European countries in 21 days, from Nordkapp in Norway to Tarifa on the Spanish coast.

Cycling and opening up about his struggles transformed Ryan's life. He became a peer support worker for Mind in Bradford and spoke at prisons, schools and universities about mental health.

Following the suicide of a footballer from his hometown, Ryan realised that there was no male support group in the local area of Oxenhope. "His brother mentioned to me that he'd probably still be around if there was an Andy's Man Club in the local area. I was working for Mind then and thought about possibly doing something at a local pub."

Ryan organised a meet-up at The Hop On Worth in Keighley town centre. He hoped to emulate the experience he had at Andy Man's Club and provide

a supportive space for men to speak about their struggles.

"Normally, it's a group who have challenges in their life sat round a table, having a drink and talking about their struggles together," Ryan explains.

The group quickly evolved from being a men's only support group to include all genders. "A young man from Wilsden who went to Bingley Grammar lost his life to suicide. His family became involved with us. His cousin Megan Russell was grieving, and she suggested that women would benefit from a support group too."

The group had set up only two weeks before the COVID lockdown. "We had a temporary closure until the rules were determined," he explains. "Then we opened at parks and in town halls, continued running, and were socially distanced."

The groups were much needed as people struggled with isolation and the change in their daily routines. "Attendances grew, and therefore, the

people that came wanted to help further and open their own groups."

Today, there are 12 groups running under the #ItsWorthTalkingAbout banner, including men's and women's groups across Keighley, Haworth and Bingley, along with a mixed group in Bradford and Keighley and a youth group in Haworth. The charity also has a men's football team.

"Several of the guys in our groups wanted to encourage people to get outdoors and get active. It's good for bonding and provides a support circle. Anyone who wants to come watch or play is more than welcome."

Volunteers are the backbone of #ItsWorthTalkingAbout. From handing out leaflets and taking pictures at the Bingley Weekender to spreading awareness at Saltaire festival, volunteering allows those struggling to speak to the people involved. "It helps them find the courage to attend

a support group. Awareness is everything regarding mental health - reducing the stigma and allowing people to know support is available and what we do."


If you'd like to volunteer, get in touch or attend a group. "Come to the sessions to see what we actually do, so you've been there and know you like it," Ryan recommends.

Jerk-Style Chicken with Rice and Beans from previous page

Rice $Long\ grain\ white\ rice\$ Serves 4 Preparation time $15\ mins\$ Cooking time $30\ mins$

INGREDIENTS

4 chicken drumsticks, scored

4 chicken thighs, excess skin removed and scored

2 tbsp oil

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ - 2 tbsp Jerk seasoning

1 onion, chopped

1 clove garlic, chopped

400ml can reduced fat coconut milk

250g long grain rice

400g can kidney beans, drained and rinsed Fresh thyme

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 200C, gas mark 6. Place the chicken in a big bowl and toss in 1 tbsp oil and the Jerk seasoning.

Transfer to a large baking tray and roast for 30 minutes until cooked throughout.

Meanwhile, heat the remaining oil in a large saucepan and fry the onion and garlic for 3-4 minutes until golden.

Add the coconut milk and 200ml water and bring to the boil, add the rice and kidney beans, cover and simmer gently for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally or until the rice is tender and the liquid has been absorbed.

Serve the rice and beans with the chicken and its juices and garnish with chopped thyme

Korean Beef Bibimbap

Rice $Basmati\ rice$ Serves 2 Preparation time $15\ mins$ Cooking time $15\ mins$ **INGREDIENTS METHOD** Cook the rice in boiling water for 10-12 minutes until 125g basmati rice tender, drain well. ½ tbsp oil Meanwhile, heat the oil in a frying pan and fry the 250g stir fry beef, thinly sliced beef for 2-3 minutes, add the chilli paste and cook for 1 ½ tbsp gochujang chilli paste minute, stir in 1 tbsp water. 

THE MAN WHO SAVES CINEMAS

ANDREW LIDDLE TALKS TO **CHARLES MORRIS** WHO OWNS AND CHERISHES SIX INDEPENDENT CINEMAS

oylake, a dignified seaside town at the sandy west end of the Wirral Peninsula, once boasted a particularly fine cinema, the Winter Gardens. Charles Morris was sevenyears-years old when, with his parents, he first set foot in it. It was 1958 and the animated film being

shown, The Lady and the Tramp, had already become a well-loved Disney classic.

With the vivid clarity of Hollywood technicolour, he remembers everything about the occasion. To echo one of the film's most delightful musical numbers it was Charles's Bella Notte, 'the beautiful night when the heavens are right' and a magical spell is woven.

He was in love with cinema, hooked for life. After this first taste, it was difficult to keep him from hanging around on the prom outside the venerable building converted for use as a silent cinema in 1931. "I started to cultivate the staff," he remembers, "began helping

out, mending seats, making myself useful doing odd jobs." By the time he was ten he was assisting in the projection room, learning how to change the reels of 35 mm film every 20 minutes.

Christmas Eve 1963 is the night he cherishes most of all. "I ran my first film, completely unassisted." His voice still carries a boyish sense

of wonder. "Even though the projectionist was somewhere in the house he never came in and just let me get on with it!"

Unfortunately his memories are not all sunnily nostalgic and darker dates are imprinted on his mind. By the late-1950s audiences were declining and the cinema closed on 3rd January 1959. It re-opened in May 1960 only to be threatened with closure

again nine months later. "I was most anxious that it should be kept open and I took a great interest in developments."

He remembers hand-painting a series of advertising posters to display. A petition organised by a member of staff attracted a large

number of signatures and fortunately the cinema was saved. He little realised at the time but this was the first of many endangered cinemas that he would make it his life's work to save.

Fast forward to the early 1980s and we find Charles, an electronic engineer for the Ministry of Defence, still keeping his hand in as a projectionist by taking part-time jobs in the local cinema of whichever town his work took him. While holidaying in the Yorkshire Dales, he spotted an opportunity to show films in the Victoria Hall, Settle, and surprisingly turned a small profit. "The seed of an idea started to germinate."

He is eternally grateful to his wife, Judy, for encouraging him soon afterwards to acquire his very own picture house. "She could see my passion for cinema, knew how much it meant to me." An opportunity had arisen in the Calder Valley town of Elland to lease The Rex, one of the oldest purpose-built cinemas in the country. Sadly fallen on hard times, it had closed after an unsuccessful spell as a bingo hall.

In partnership with Peter Berry, a former manager of the Rex, Charles and Judy took on the tremendous task of renovating a building which had stood empty for three years and been vandalised. "Everything needed redoing," he recalls, "and we did every job ourselves – except laying the carpets on the 70 by 30 square-foot floor." He took particular pride and pleasure in personally adding the finishing touch, installing the projection equipment.

The cinema was not an immediate success, however, and barely broke even in the first three months. It took enormous determination to succeed and many hours distributing publicity material to raise public awareness. Ironically it was the power of television, a medium that was inflicting most damage on cinema, that gave The Rex the much needed boost.

After a local television channel featured it in a news items on the 75th anniversary of the cinema, audiences started arriving in huge numbers to see the ultimate escapist film of its day, Shirley Valentine.

He next took the Royalty Cinema in Bowness on a 25-year lease with no break. "It was a risk," he reflects," but one worth taking, even though it was all crazy for the first few years." It meant that he had to give up his job and spend many hours commuting between Elland and the Lake District, where he and Judy now decided to make their home.

It was only in 1996 when they decided to rescue The Picture House. "By now a pattern was developing," Charles considers. "We could see what needed doing to each, sense what type of films would have local appeal, knew how to make it work."

But it was far from plain sailing when two years later they acquired the Skipton Plaza. "It was a bit of a challenge," he concedes, "it was an old building in need of a lot of work, but eventually we turned it round."

They began to set their sights on having a business nearer their home. The closed ABC cinema Regal in Lancaster was their next project, in 2003. "We reopened it as the Regal and were welcomed with open arms – and had three and a half glorious years there until a newly-built multiplex in town killed us."

In 2005 they took over the Cottage Road Cinema in Leeds which was on the point of closure and the following year added the beautiful Art Deco Roxy, in Ulverston, to their stable.

Charles can now reflect on a 65-year connection with cinema and with enormous pride on the cinemas he has saved and which are beginning to flourish again after the lean lockdown times.

He has now gone 17 years without adding any more. "We said some time ago six is enough," Charles says. "Any more would need a much bigger set-up with greater demands on the profits."

So that is definitely the last? "Well, I'd certainly consider any approach if a cinema might otherwise go under." He smiles. "I always did like a new project."

If there is such a thing as a born cinema projectionist, it is surely Charles Morris.



OPENING UP A CONVERSATION ON MENTAL HEALTH

Giving our children and young people opportunities to open up is one of the biggest things we can do as parents and carers to support their well-being.

t can be easy to forget the simple power of sharing what we're going through and feeling heard. But even though you can't fix everything when your child is struggling, you can make them feel seen and understood, which can make them feel more able to cope.

It also supports them to practise thinking and talking about their feelings, helping them to get to know themselves on a conscious level, what their needs are and when that need is not being met.

However, talking isn't always easy, right? You might feel like you don't know where to start, when a 'good time' is, or how your young person will react. Or, you might be worried about making things worse or saying the wrong thing. These are all normal worries, but remember that your child doesn't need you to always get it right. They just need to know you're there.

In my experience, most children and young people find talking easier while doing an activity. This takes the pressure off as they don't have to sit and make eye contact, and mainly it makes the pauses and silences more comfortable for both of you.

Having something in their hands or something practical to focus on can really help to make it easier for some children to think more clearly and reflect. Doing an activity together rather than having 'the big chat' makes your conversation more natural.



Here are some of my conversation starter top tips that encourage an open conversation.

- What was the best part of your day?
- What was the worst part of your day?
- What did you do today that made you proud?
- How are you feeling?
- What would you like to talk about?

If they are having a hard time, you could try and find out how they would like you to support them by asking gentle, soft questions like:

- How can I support you through this?
- Do you want to talk about what's going on?
- Is there anything that you need from me? Space, time to talk?
- What was the biggest problem that you had today? What helped?

It's important to reassure them that you are always there for them to talk to and that they can come to you anytime. To help encourage this, you could try saying things like:

- You can talk to me at any time.
- If you want to talk to me about something worrying you, I will do my best to help.

 Even if I don't understand it

Even if I don't understand it, please know I want to.

- Even though it feels big to you, I can handle whatever you want to tell me.
- We are in this together, and I am right by your side.
- You can speak to someone else if you don't want to talk to me. I won't be upset.

To feel seen and heard is so important when a child or young person tells you that they are struggling, so when responding to them can help to:

- Validate their feelings. You could say, "It's understandable that you are feeling this way", to let them know that their feelings are ok.
- Always thank them for sharing what is going on.
- Let them know that you are there for them and love them. That they can talk to you anytime they need to and that you can help get them support if that is what they want.
- Ask if you could do anything that is particularly helpful right now.
- Spend time together exploring what's making them feel this way.
- Inform them of any helplines or online chat services they can use.
- Remind them that this is only temporary, as is everything, and these big feelings won't last.
 Reassure them that things get better and they will feel better in time.
- Try not to have conversations like these at times of distress. They will be in a flight, fight or freeze state and will not be receptive to conversations like this.

If you think your child or young person needs professional support, a good place to start is your GP, and in some cases, it can be helpful to talk to their school or college about what support they can offer. You can always contact me on my social media pages if I can help.


